Dear Friends and Supporters of the Forsyth Humane Society,

The start of my tenure as President of the Board of Directors came with a bit of a surprise. Sarah Williamson, our beloved Executive Director, was retiring. After an exhaustive search and interviews with multiple candidates, it became clear that our Interim Executive Director, Mark Neff was the clear choice for the position, and he hit the ground running.

Under Mark's leadership, we began the difficult task of emerging from under the burden of the pandemic. Our leadership team and the dedicated staff began the task of reopening the Country Club facility to the public, which they successfully completed months ahead of schedule, culminating in an FHS Community Day. Volunteers were encouraged to return, provided exceptional training on our new post-Covid beginnings, and leaped at the opportunity to pick up where they had left off.

Despite the challenges posed by the pandemic, our foster system was stronger than ever, at times with more than 400 animals in foster care. The success of the FHS is directly dependent on the amazing foster network. From newborn kittens to senior dogs, our foster families have not hesitated to open their hearts and their homes to those animals in greatest need. Due largely to their efforts, we maintained a Save Rate of 76%, adopting over 2000 animals, transferring over 1000 animals to partner organizations, and returning over 800 animals to their loving homes.

The pandemic changed the world we live in. Through the diligent efforts of FHS staff and volunteers, we have proven that despite the hardships we have faced and those yet to come, the Forsyth Humane Society will continue to #SaveFursyth.


