On March 31st, 2023, our contract with Forsyth County Animal Shelter ended, marking the conclusion of a five-year period where we touched over 35,000 animal and human lives. While it was a difficult decision to leave our location at the University North building due to unresolved negotiation terms, our board of directors and executive leadership worked tirelessly for many months to secure a sustainable operation. Although we are saddened by the impact of this transition, Forsyth Humane Society remains committed to our mission of promoting and providing humane treatment to cats and dogs in Forsyth County, North Carolina. Despite this change, our organization's eighty-year history of helping people find their furry friends has contributed to creating a more compassionate community. We are grateful to everyone who supported us by advocating for us to the county commissioners. As we embark on new programming, we look forward to working together to make positive changes for both pets and their people.


