Essential Functions of a Summer Camp Participant

Participants must:

- Have a desire to learn about animal welfare and animal sheltering.
- Have effective interactions in our group-based environment (pair work, group projects, etc.)
- Abide by the Code of Conduct and Behavior Guidelines.
- Forsyth Humane Society does not administer oral or topical medications.
 Campers must be able to administer their own medications during the program hours.
- Understand that petting a dog and/or cat is not guaranteed each day. Animal
 interactions occur with the safety and wellbeing of all parties involved.

If you have any questions about the essential functions listed above or your child requires specific accommodations, please contact us. We would be happy to talk to you about your camper's specific needs and how to create a successful camp experience for them.

Prior to the Week of Camp

• Electronic health screening and behavior consent forms must be filled out and submitted by the Wednesday before a campers' first day of camp.

Things to Bring Each Day

- FHS will provide snacks for campers during each camp day.
- Campers should bring a refillable water bottle.
- Sunscreen, hat and bug spray are optional, but encouraged for use during any outdoor activities.
- Comfortable clothes and closed-toed shoes are required.

Forsyth Humane Society uses peanut butter for animal enrichment. Please let us know if your child has any allergies and be aware that your child may be exposed during shelter tours.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up Drop-off Time and Location

 Front Lobby of Adoption and Resource Center. A pick-up pass will be provided to registrants that must be displayed in their vehicle at the time of pick-up. A photo ID may be used in lieu of the pick-up pass so long as their legal name is a confirmed pick-up person.

Late Pick-Up Fees

 All campers must be picked up on time. Any camper picked up at 12:10 pm or later will be subject to a late pick-up fee.

Health & Safety

- We follow guidance and recommendations from public health officials when determining safety measures for our Kids Camps. Face coverings are not required at this time. You will be informed if our policies change.
- Campers or staff that display signs of illness will be sent home.
- Multiple hand washing breaks will be taken, and hand sanitizing stations are throughout the Adoption and Resource Center.
- Campers may be exposed to zoonotic diseases (infections that are spread between people and animals). Precautions will be taken, and exposure is unlikely.
- To ensure the cleanliness of our shelter we utilize cleaning products that campers may be exposed to.

Refunds and Cancellations

• Full refunds will be given 3 weeks prior to camp if you choose to cancel.

FAQ

- I have children of different ages (ex: a rising 1st grader and rising 3rd grader), can they attend the same camp?
 - Children of different ages may attend the same camp if the older child is no more than one grade level above that camp's age range. The older child must attend the younger child's camp, younger children cannot move up.
